## A NOTE FROM OUR PRESIDENT

### Dear Fellowship Square Supporters:

It is true Fellowship Square has made formidable progress in the past year; however, I am also reminded that it is true this progress is due, in part, from “standing on the shoulders of giants”. More specifically, my immediate predecessors in my position, Renée Jakobs and Eddie Byrne, set in motion Fellowship Square’s current Board of Directors’ renaissance, in conjunction with the new Executive Director, Christy Zeitz, and property manager, Debbie Franco of SL Nusbaum. Renée streamlined Board meetings, allowing more achievement in less time; Eddie off-loaded much of the Board work to the Board Committees, thereby allowing the Board to accomplish more at each meeting. Not that any of this new-found efficiency could be done without the concerted efforts of Fellowship Square staff and the modernized management practices of SL Nusbaum. The view of the Board is now, more than ever, directed at the horizon.

Of significant moment is the reorganization of the House Board(s) structure by revising their Bylaws to allow more flexibility and self-governance; plus, closer communication between property management and Fellowship staff; and closer contact with our primary objective, the residents. Most of this has been administrative in nature: by integrating management goals and objectives; opening the lines of communication; and consensus governing... something the Board may have decreed but was consummated by diligent and focused efforts on the part of the combined staffs.

Additionally, the ‘construction project(s)’ continue apace:

- Lake Anne has been given provisional, initial approval of the roughly \$80 million new construction proposal by the Reston Design Review Board and the Fairfax County Zoning Commission, and the process of lining up appropriate financing and construction contracts are the next steps.
- Hunters Woods has laid the groundwork for the \$6-8 million refinancing and renovation of the property through a new, HUD-guaranteed refinance by hiring a HUD-expert consultant, a construction project manager and a (HUD compliant) construction company, with refinancing negotiations underway.

The Asset Management Committee has been meeting weekly (via conference calls) for the past year – headed by Eddie Byrne – with a remarkable supporting cast of accountants, builders, and construction management experts serving as Board and Committee members.

Finally, both the Fellowship Board, as well as the House Boards, have expanded, adding needed expertise, with an emphasis on Board education and implementation of “best practices.” Monthly committee meetings and reports, as well as an ‘educational component’ at each Board Meeting, contribute to a focus on governance and oversight, and ensure regular communication of current events among the members. Annual Workshops to update Board awareness and evaluation of the organization’s visioning, infrastructure, and goals progress have become a regularity, both for Fellowship Square and the individual House Boards.

Overall, Fellowship Square Foundation, Inc. has taken positive measures to improve its efficiency, effectiveness, and delivery of services to its constituency – the Fellowship House residents who are seniors with very limited income who are the focus of our mission. I am pleased to be a part of this organization. If you feel motivated to join our mission and efforts, by all means, call now (!) operators are standing by!

## THE SOLUTION

Fellowship Square is home to

**800+** SENIORS

living on a very low fixed income.

More than just a roof over their heads, we provide a multitude of programs and services to enhance their quality of living and help them age in place. At the same time, we work diligently within affordable housing coalitions to raise the alarm that more development is needed.

Fellowship Square contracts with the US Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to cover expenses associated with each property including overall property management, mortgages, construction costs, building maintenance, taxes, insurance, and rent subsidies. The housing contracts with HUD require Fellowship Square to meet federal regulations pertaining to income profiles of residents. Residents' rents are no more than 30% of their annual income.

Residents' rents are

NO MORE THAN **30%** OF THEIR ANNUAL INCOME

living on a very low fixed income.

## Who Are Fellowship Square Residents?

**76** AVERAGE AGE      **\$12,157** ANNUAL INCOME

After rent and medical expenses, the average resident has \$640 per month to cover transportation, living expenses, personal items and food.

Fellowship Square's residents come from next door and around the world. They have labored in occupations with little or no retirement benefits; from teacher to beautician to farmer. Some residents are formerly homeless while others are refugees from forced labor camps. The one thing they share is survival on a limited income. Without Fellowship Square, they would live in less than ideal conditions.



**Hunters Woods Fellowship House** and **Lake Anne Fellowship House** each have more than **eight foreign languages** spoken within their buildings.



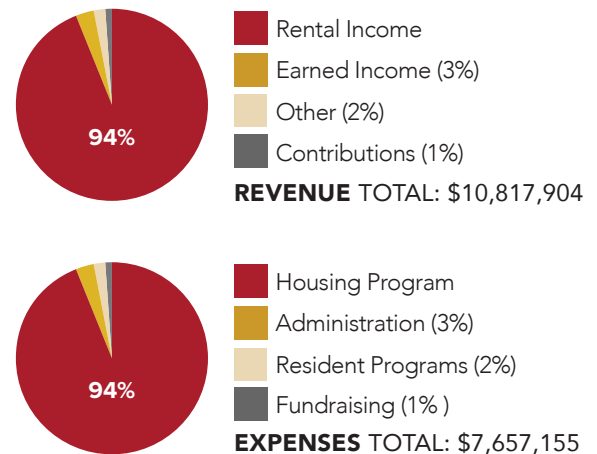
## DID YOU KNOW?

- Nearly 70% of residents surveyed are female. More than half live alone.
- The most commonly used languages are English, Chinese and Korean.
- More than 40% of residents surveyed are married.
- 27% of residents surveyed reported having earned a college degree and 10% earned a post-graduate degree.

## LAKE ANNE REDEVELOPMENT



### Our Most Ambitious Undertaking

In 2016, Fellowship Square entered into a partnership agreement with Community Preservation and Development Corp to redevelop the Lake

Anne Fellowship House. The nearly \$80 million project includes the construction of a new 240-apartment building and the demolition of the existing Fellowship House. In 2018, the project team received approval by both the Reston Design Review Board and the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors to move forward on our plans. This is a huge milestone in our efforts to redevelop this property and provide residents with a new modern building that will serve them and hundreds of other future residents. The project is expected to be completed in 2022.

## HUNTERS WOODS FELLOWSHIP HOUSE



### An Investment in Our Future

We have assembled a professional team of consultants and construction managers to assist

us in refinancing and renovating Hunters Woods Fellowship House. Since opening in 1979, the building has served hundreds of residents and provided a place for both community meetings and resident activities. Walking into Hunters Woods today, you can see that the building could use some upgrades. By refinancing the project, we will have funds available to not only make major improvements to the building including heating/cooling systems, converting 12 units into fully accessible units and fully modernizing the common space, but we will also have funds to invest in future projects including the addition of other properties to the Fellowship Square portfolio. The renovation project is expected to be completed in 2021.

The Wegener Chaplaincy was established by a gift from the members of Georgetown Lutheran Church in honor of Rev. William Wegener's retirement. Rev. Wegener was active in the work of Fellowship Square for many years. Today, Rev. Frederick G. Klein serves as our resident pastor, visiting residents each week at all the Fellowship House properties. Pastor Klein has served in this role at Fellowship Square for the last six years and has been in the pastoral ministry of the Lutheran Church for 45 years. He holds master's degrees in theology, education and counseling. He is a nationally certified counselor (NCC).

The Wegener Chaplaincy continues to be sustained by donations from individuals and faith communities. The chaplaincy is supported solely by private donations and is provided to residents at no cost. 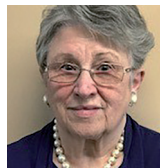
- Securing SSI income
