



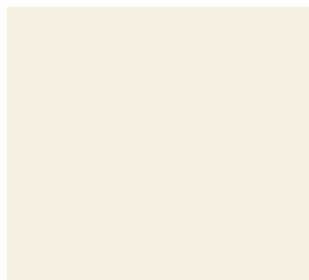
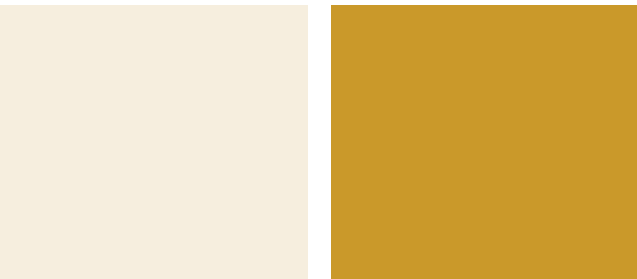

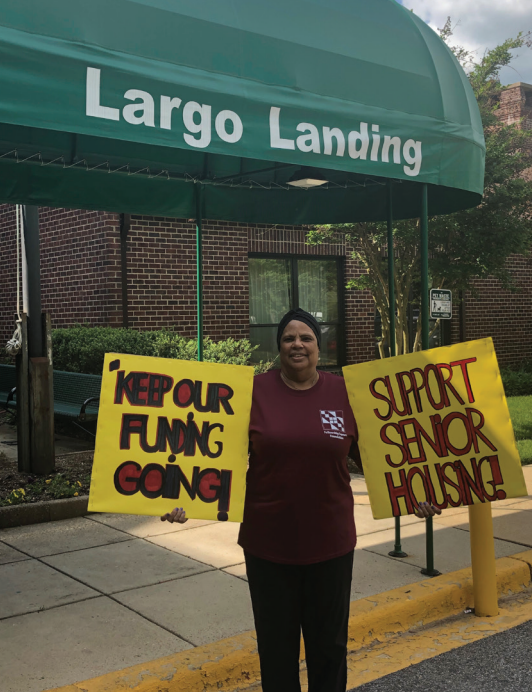

FELLOWSHIP SQUARE ADVOCACY RESULTS IN 17% INCREASE IN HUD FUNDING!

The final FY2020 U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Section 202 bill provided \$793 million for the 'Housing for the Elderly' program which was \$115 million (or 17 %) more than in FY 2019. The program provides funds to develop low-income housing for seniors with access to supportive services, and provides rental assistance that fills the gap between the actual rent costs and what the resident can afford to pay.

SENIOR HOUSING NOW RALLY

On May 8, 2019, more than 100 residents from all four Fellowship Square affordable housing properties in Maryland and Virginia gathered at the U.S. Capitol in Washington, D.C. to urge Congress to protect and expand affordable housing for older adults. These seniors added their voices with hundreds of other Americans of advanced age from across the country as part of the Senior Housing Now rally.



LEADING AGE 2019 LOBBY DAY

Fellowship Square's CEO, Christy Zeitz, among other senior housing providers, spent a day in late March on Capitol Hill educating Senators and Representatives on the need for more affordable housing to address the growing problem of the housing shortage among seniors with very low incomes.

INVESTING IN THE FUTURE



The redevelopment of Fellowship Square's Lake Anne property is an ongoing \$84 million project that includes the construction of a new 240-apartment building that will replace the existing property. The project is expected to be completed in 2023.

LAKE ANNE REDEVELOPMENT 2019 HIGHLIGHTS

Significant progress has been achieved for the redevelopment effort led by our partner, the Community Preservation and Development Corporation (CPDC).

Existing mortgages have been **paid in full**.

Working closely with the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) and the Fairfax County Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD), a new rental subsidy package through the project-based voucher program has been successfully obtained and is being implemented for all eligible residents.

Obtained **final design approval** for the new Lake Anne facility from the Reston Association Design Review Board including a public art initiative.

We have **secured a full financing package** for the new facility that includes construction, interim and permanent financing through the Virginia Housing Development Authority, Enterprise Community Loan Fund, and Fairfax County HCD plus equity investment from the Low Income Housing Tax Credit program through Capital One.

Completed and submitted to Fairfax County all necessary design and construction documents leading to the issuance of permits allowing for construction to be initiated by mid-2020.

Residents receive **regular progress updates** so they are fully aware of the timing of the project and what they can expect over the course of this exciting endeavor.



HUNTERS WOODS RENOVATION

Since opening its doors in 1979, Fellowship Square's Hunters Woods property has provided affordable housing to hundreds of seniors and served as a space for community gatherings for Reston's residents. The 40+ years of wear and tear on the property means that considerable upgrades – not just “band-aid fixes” – are needed so that Hunters Woods continues to meet the increasing housing demands for older adults well into the future.

IMPROVEMENTS TO MODERNIZE

Reconfiguring 12 apartments into accessible units for residents with disabilities or mobility issues

Roof replacement with upgrades to air handling units and exhaust vents

Modernizing the heating/cooling system, improving overall building energy efficiency

Updating building exterior and landscaping

New entrance and lobby area with indoor/outdoor seating

New flooring, finishes and lighting throughout

ENHANCED RESIDENT-LIFE

Media room for movies, news, sports

Computer kiosks with internet access

Flex space that allows for small group activities simultaneously or large group functions for 80+ people at one time

Game room with ping-pong tables

Outdoor senior **fitness stations**

Upgrades to the kitchen to allow for better use by volunteers who prepare and serve residents at monthly luncheons; creation of cooking demonstration area

THE KEYS TO HEALTHY AGING

At each Fellowship House, we have an onsite **Service Coordinator** (SC) who works with residents to help them maintain healthy, active lifestyles, and to empower them to become more self-sufficient and exert control over the decisions that affect them. The SC's also help navigate Medicare, Medicaid and other benefits to which residents are entitled, and serve as liaisons between community resources and the residents. Each Service Coordinator is an integral part of the Fellowship Square team and not only works closely with the residents, but gets to know the family members as well, keeping them informed and engaged in their loved ones' lives.

As part of the Fellowship Square mission, we seek to provide pastoral care and counseling to residents to help them cope with the many stressful issues they face from day to day. The Wegener Chaplaincy program was established by a gift from the members of Georgetown Lutheran Church in honor of Rev. William Wegener's retirement. Rev. Wegener was active in the work of Fellowship Square for many years.

Today, Rev. Frederick G. Klein serves as our resident pastor, visiting well over 1,000 residents annually at all the Fellowship House properties. Pastor Klein has served in this role at Fellowship Square for the last seven years and has been in the pastoral ministry of the Lutheran Church for 45 years. He holds master's degrees in theology, education and counseling. He is a nationally certified counselor (NCC).
