PRESIDENT'S NOTE

Dear Friends,

I am happy to report on a year of accomplishments at Fellowship Square—we're still standing strong! We continue to be vigilant against this virus—and we have moved forward in various ways beyond its grip.

Starting mid-January 2021, our Fellowship Square residents were among the first in the nation to receive their **COVID-19 vaccinations**. Our partners in this effort, CVS and Walgreens pharmacies, went door to door offering the vaccinations to more than 800 Fellowship House residents. Our vaccination rate was close to the 85% mark!

In May, residents ventured out, and life was buzzing at all of our communities. Residents cautiously took part in **events and activities** and a sense of normalcy was returning. The summer months helped to relieve much of the social isolation, fear and worry that many residents had been experiencing for many months. While safety protocols remained in effect, like mandatory mask requirements, social distancing and regular cleaning, residents were once again talking and laughing with one another.

Our Lake Anne **redevelopment** project and our Hunters Woods Fellowship House **renovation** continued with great momentum. We completed property improvements at Lake Ridge Fellowship House and Largo Landing Fellowship House as well.

The year culminated with our most successful **Winter Wonderland fundraiser** yet—raising funds to help us continue our resident programming, adding to our emergency fund for residents and giving a much-needed boost to our overall operations ensuring we're able to continue to meet everyday challenges.

At the end of 2021, we put the finishing touches on a new **five-year strategic plan** where we laid out our desire to continue to build the organization and our footprint so that we can provide more affordable housing and services to those in need. I hope to see many of you at our annual meeting or at this year's Winter Wonderland event. Until then, I deeply thank you for your ongoing support and dedication to our mission, and most of all, to our residents.

HUGE PROGRESS IN 2021

Fellowship Square's two largest endeavors to date made huge strides in 2021. Our \$86 million **Lake Anne House**, built in partnership with Enterprise Community Development, nears the finish line as residents prepare to move into their brand new building in spring 2022. Subsidies for all units will be retained—no small feat! Our \$23 million **Hunters Woods** renovation project also progressed unfettered throughout 2021.

The Roof is On at the New Lake Anne House!

In May, about one year into construction, the new **Lake Anne House** was "topped off," a major milestone in new construction. This allowed the construction team to begin installing HVAC and

other interior systems. More importantly, it got the building substantially closer to being weathertight, which cleared the path to installing interior drywall and finishes.

In October, Board members, donors and other special guests got a an up-close-and-personal glimpse of the new Lake Anne House during a Hard Hat Tour of the new building.

Residents will begin moving into their new building in spring 2022!









Hunters Woods Fellowship House— Upgraded

In February, **Hunters Woods** Fellowship House residents celebrated the end of Phase I which included replacement of all heating units in the apartments, roof work, updates to the trash and recycling rooms, upgrades of the common area air handlers and remodeling of the accessible units to bring them into compliance with today's standards.

Phase II of the Hunters Woods renovation began in March with both exterior and interior improvements. Ultimately, the completed renovation will significantly enhance the property. The renovation work will enable Hunters Woods Fellowship House to remain an integral part of the greater Reston community and continue to provide local affordable senior housing.

COVID-19 VACCINE COMES TO THE FELLOWSHIP HOUSES

In January, residents in our Fellowship Square communities in Reston and Woodbridge received the COVID-19 vaccine as the state opened phase 1B of vaccinations. Residents at our Upper Marlboro property in Maryland followed suit shortly thereafter.



WEGENER CHAPLAINCY PROGRAM

Over the years, Fellowship Square has provided pastoral care and counseling to help residents cope with the many stressful issues they face from day to day.

The **Wegener Chaplaincy** program was established by a gift from the members of Georgetown Lutheran Church in honor of Rev. William Wegener's retirement. Rev. Wegener was active in the work of Fellowship Square for many years. The program continues to be supported by donations from individuals and faith communities.



Since 2012, Rev. Fred Klein served as the Pastoral counselor and confidante to many Fellowship House residents. He retired in April 2021. Over the years, he visited hundreds of residents—at the Houses, in the hospital and in rehabilitation facilities. He led weekly bible studies, offered Communion and was a dear friend to many residents—helping them through troubled times and enjoying easy conversations about life. For some, he was the only person they could talk to about their personal issues or family trauma.


